Bio of Terrance Campbell

Mr. Terrance Campbell is a major academic journal reviewer that uses Information Security and Instructional Systems to positively impact health outcomes; including workforce readiness and mobilization. He has held numerous positions ranging from Hardware Technician to Campus College Chair for Information Systems and Technology (equivalent to a Dean) to an executive-level manager for a Not-For-Profit organization. Customer bases as small as 10 and as large as 6,000+ locally and 150,000+ worldwide have been serviced during my tenure. In addition, Mr. Campbell has maintained and documented budgets in excess of \$10 million dollars and managed teams ranging from 2 to 175+ people.

During this time, he assisted in founding a faith-based HIV Prevention agency in Flint, MI called YOUR Center (YC). Collectively, the team has 100-years of using community-academic partners to assist individuals', groups' and community's capacity to collaborate in the process of using use technology and digital mediums to design, implement, and evaluate interventions to positively impact health outcomes. Some of the collaborative partners include: (a) The National Faith Mobilization Network; (b) the University of Michigan School of Information; (c) the Wayne State University College of Education; (d) the National Community Based Organization Network; (e) the American Public Health Association Community Based Public Health Caucus; (f) the Genesee County Coalition of Pastors for Social Action; (g) the Genesee County Church of GOD in CHRIST Alliance; and (h) Tech Town Detroit.

Some highlights of YC's impact to include: (a) raising the awareness of the social, economic and national security of HIV in over 50,000 congregants in over 80 faith based organizations across 9 denominations; (b) producing over 20 peer-reviewed articles; (c) assisting of 750 individuals obtain IT-related jobs and internships; (d) serving as the Co-PI for 2009 – 2014 CDC funded University of Michigan School of Public Health HIV Prevention and Social Media research project; (e) serving as the lead Informatics and HIV Prevention agency for the National Faith Mobilization Network; (f) serving a Steering Committee member for two projects focused on developing, implementing, and evaluating a web-based health priority setting game; (g) assisting Wayne State University College of Education VAC program to implement a Sport and Technology Academy; including onsite programming for select Detroit Housing Commission sites; (h) facilitating Coding and Animation Program for Southfield Public Schools Saturday School program since 2010; (i) serving as a founding member of the APHA Community Based Public Health Caucus Youth Council; and (j) assisted the China's Ministry of Education identify a strategy using Coding and Cybersecurity as its new generation K – 12 workforce development strategy.

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
