If you prefer an in-person court hearing simply appear at the 22nd District Court on your assigned court date. However, if attending your court date causes a hardship because you may have to miss work, you live out of state or have to secure a babysitter; you may now attend your court date remotely on ZOOM by following the instructions on your court notice. Should you decide to attend remotely, please be dressed and prepared to attend court as if you were appearing in person. If you have questions or need assistance, please contact the 22nd District Court Clerk's Office at (313) 277-8200. Rest assured, we will continue to provide the same high level of service regardless of whether you appear in person or remotely for your next court appearance.

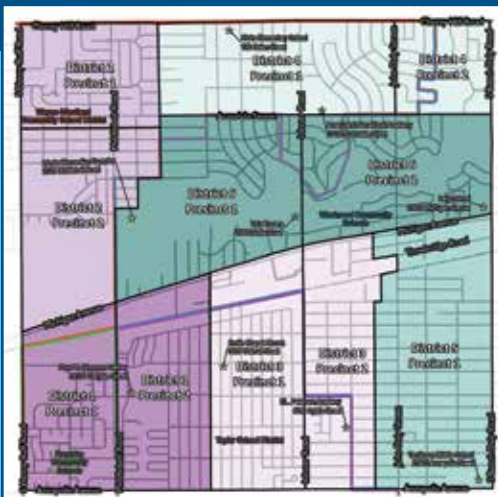

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- **Completed:** An open space Amphitheatre on Inkster and South River Park Drive. The funds were allocated by state appropriations through the office of State Rep. Jewell Jones.
- **Completed:** Bathrooms, showers, and common area renovations inside the Booker T. Dozier Center. The Wayne County Warren C. Evans Executive Office allocated 800 thousand dollars through a Community Development Block Grant to help remodel the rec center.
- **Completed:** Renovations of Colonial Park. The park was paved and connected to the greenway path.
- **Completed:** Rodeway Hotel on Michigan Avenue was remodeled into an affordable 1- and 2-bedroom apartment complex.
- **Completed:** Agasstation was built on the corner of Middlebelt and Michigan. Opening soon.
- **Completed:** The Old Red Carriage (in front of Heatherwood Apartments) was torn down.
- **In Development:** The construction of The Inkster Senior Wellness Center, a 2.5-million-dollar facility, is underway. Mayor Wimberly and Congresswomen Rashida Tlaib participated in the Big Check Ceremony signifying its initiation.
- **In Development:** Thanks to State Senator Dayna Polehanki, State Appropriation funds of 1.2 million dollars was allocated to the City of Inkster to develop a Historical & Cultural Art Museum at the old library. It is slated to open early 2023.
- **In Development:** A sidewalk replacement program with 750-thousand dollars allocated for that purpose.
- **In Development:** The old "Side Pocket" Coney Island at 364 Inkster Road is in the process of being renovated and transformed into a lounge/café.
- **Hosted:** An Expungement Fair with Attorney General Dana Nessel. Over 300 residents were served.
- **Introduced:** The Annual Homecoming Memorial Festival, a 3-day family friendly event.
- **Received:** Fifty-thousand dollars from Priority Health & National Fitness to erect an Outdoor Fitness Court
- **Sold:** The Inkster Civic Center was bought by a local developer and is in the process of being transformed into an indoor state-of-the-art athletic arena. The arena will include indoor soccer, football and more.
- **Sold:** The City of Inkster generated \$952,205.99 in land sales.
- **Updated:** The Parks and Recreation Master Plan, a roadmap for decisions over the next five years to identify future needs and how to better serve the community.
- **Granted:** Over the past year the city of Inkster generated 5.3 million through county, state, and federal appropriations.

CODE ENFORCEMENT/ANIMAL CONTROL

The Inkster Code Enforcement Division is charged with protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the community through enforcement of the Inkster City Ordinance. Working in conjunction with building and code officials, the ordinance officers enforce property maintenance codes, Dangerous Buildings Ordinance, elements of the Michigan Building Codes, as well as actively seeking restitution for clean ups for non-responsive property owners and illegal dumpers.

The City currently has dedicated Code Enforcement Officers who patrol Inkster streets daily to create and preserve curb appeal in both the residential and business communities. Blight and property maintenance complaints may be e-mailed to gttriplett@cityofinkster.com. Complaints are also accepted in writing by Inkster Police Department, or by writing Inkster Code Enforcement, 26279 Michigan Avenue, Inkster, Michigan, 48141 and also by phone, (313) 563-2820, as well as by their Facebook page City of Inkster Ordinance Enforcement and Animal Control.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE

The Department of Public Service consists of three divisions: Central Services, Roads/Parks, Grounds and Water and Sewer. The City of Inkster Department of Public Works oversees the maintenance of nearly 6.2 square miles of roads within city limits. We handle snow plowing, grass cutting, flooded streets, road repairs, trees, City buildings and the beautification of the entire City. We are here to promote community service and strive to achieve our goals and objectives as a department while also keeping our community Clean Safe and Accessible.

WATER MAIN REPAIR: If you are reporting a water main break, please inform us of any significant loss of pressure or if the water appears cloudy or rusty. We will attempt to notify all customers if and when a shut off of water will be required for repairs.

Water main breaks should be reported to the Department of Public Works during business hours (7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., Monday-Friday) and to the Police Department dispatch after-hours at (313) 563-9850.

STREETLIGHTS: Residents can report streetlights that are out to DTE Energy, or to the City of Inkster. Please be able to provide

details about the location of the light and, if possible, streetlight pole number. For metal poles, the number is located at the base of the streetlight pole; for wooden poles it is located approximately eight feet up the pole (313) 563-9774.

ILLEGAL DUMPING: If you need to report an illegal dumping incident (on a city road or street, or on any piece of property either private or public) or any other suspicious activity that could potentially have a negative impact on the environment within the City of Inkster please call the Police Department at 313-563-9850 or DPS at (313) 563-9774.

REPORT A POTHOLE OR ROAD ISSUE: The State Road running through Inkster is Michigan Avenue (US-12). Inkster Road, Middlebelt & parts of Cherry Hill are maintained by Wayne County within county borders. To report an issue with a road, such as a pothole, please use the following resources:

- For city roads, call DPW at (313) 563-9774.
- For county roads, citizens can report potholes online on the Wayne County website at www.waynecounty.com/departments/publicservices/report-

If you live on a circle street you must keep your vehicles off the street on your block from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on your trash day, this allows the City's waste management contractor to more effectively picking up trash, recycling and yard waste.

Department of Public Service also provides street sweeping services, and sewer cleaning maintenance throughout the year.

SNOW EMERGENCY: Sometimes a snow emergency is announced many hours before a snowstorm to give residents plenty of warning to move their parked vehicles so they won't get ticketed once the snow emergency is in effect. This often happens if an early morning storm is predicted. Citizens can also check the City's website to see if a snow emergency is in effect at www.cityofinkster.com

Driveways may be covered during snowplowing

Please take into consideration that driveway approaches will be covered with snow from street plowing operations. It is an inconvenience, but necessary so that roads can remain safe for drivers. Do not put snow from your driveway or sidewalk back into the street. It is also a good idea to remove parked vehicles when City crews are salting roads, to allow for better coverage.



WATER & ROAD PROJECTS

- **Lead Service Replacement Program.** We replace 67 lead lines a year until all lead lines are replaced. Completion expected in year 2034.
- **Hydrant Replacement Program.** We received grant funding of \$245,000.00 for fire hydrants and fire hydrant replacements. Advertise for Bids in March 2023.
- **Avondale Road Reconstruction Phase 1 (Henry Ruff Rd. to Middlebelt).** Installed all new water main, sanitary sewer and replaced lead water services. Due to Industry wide concrete shortage, pouring of concrete was delayed to the beginning of December 2022.
- **Northwest Quadrant Road Reconstruction.** Trees have been removed, and trenchless sanitary sewer work has been completed. Road reconstruction work will begin in Spring of 2023.
- **Eastern Outfalls CSO Elimination Phase 1.** Due to lead time to receive materials and supply chain interruptions. Work is set to begin in Spring of 2023.
- **N. River Park Drive Watermain & Lead Service Replacement.** Delayed due to lead time to receive materials and supply chain interruptions. Construction is set to begin Spring of 2023.
- **Section 17 Watermain & Lead Service Replacement.** Delayed due to lead time to receive materials and supply chain interruptions. Construction is set to begin Spring of 2023.
- **Speed Bump Program.** Grant money was awarded by MDOT to install approximately 36 or more speed bumps at 15 road segments identified by the Police. Construction will begin Fiscal Year 2023.
- **Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation- Phase 1 & 2.** All sewer rehabilitation completed in Phase 1, select restoration and manhole rehabilitation remaining for Phase 1 & 2.

All the above projects are overseen by Maya Roots, Special Project Manager for Department of Public Service, under the great leadership of Mayor Patrick Wimberly and Jerome Bivins, Director of Department of Public Service.

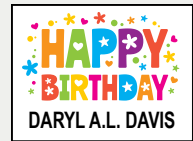

Helpful Water Tips

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

- A household faucet runs at 3 to 5 gallons a minute.
- The average American family turns on the water tap 70 to 100 times per day. [U.S. EPA]
- 40% of the water used each day by the average person is flushed down the toilet.
- Avoid using the toilet for a wastebasket. Every flush you eliminate can save between two and seven gallons of water.
- Twice a year, check all faucets inside and outside for leaks. Replace worn out fixtures, washers, O-rings, and hose connections. Turn off faucets firmly.
- A faucet that drips at the rate of one drop per second will waste 2,700 gallons in 2 months. [American Water and Energy Savers, Inc.]
- Check appliances' connecting hoses and faucets for leaks. Even a pinhole leak wastes up to 170 gallons a day.
- Install a low flow showerhead and keep showers under five minutes.
- Filling the bathtub uses about 30 gallons of water. Plug the tub when you shower; how full does the tub get?
- Wash clothes wisely. Match washer's load selector to your load size.
- Sump Pump Buddy, a back up sump pump tied into your water supply system that is activated when there is a power outage. These systems need to be checked out once the power has been restored. These systems at times have failed to shut off resulting in large water bills, and flooding basements.

Water Waste at 40 Pounds Pressure

- A 1/32" leak wastes 170 gallons/24 hours
- A 1/16" leak wastes 970 gallons/24 hours
- A 1/8" leak wastes 3600 gallons/24 hours
- A 1/4" leak wastes 11,030 gallons/24 hours

Water Facts

To provide your lawn with one inch of water takes a little over half a gallon per square

foot (0.623 gallon to be more exact). That means that every 10'x10' area will require over 62 gallons of water. That doesn't sound like much until you consider that a 100' x 100' lawn uses 6,230 gallons (8.32 units) of water every time you turn on the sprinklers!

Most swimming pools fall in the range of 15-30,000 gallons (though many pools fall outside that range). That might seem like a lot of water, but it's probably not that much more than what you're already using every month. According to the EPA, the average family of four can use 400 gallons of water per day, or 12,000 gallons per month. Example:

- A circular pool 15 feet in diameter and 4.34 feet deep holds 5,736.72 gallons of water equivalent to 7.67 units of water.
- A circular pool 18 feet in diameter and 4.34 feet deep holds 8,260.88 gallons of water equivalent to 11.05 units of water.

A toilet leak at 19 gallons every five minutes, or 164,000 gallons in a month. Contrary to what some might think, it is entirely possible for a running toilet to lose that much, or significantly more.

Average inside water for a family of four is 6,000 gallons per month. That costs over \$350 in unnecessary water usage charges for just one month.

Running toilets account for the vast majority of leaks found inside the home. While nobody wants to admit their toilet leaks, it is estimated that about 20% of all toilets leak slightly. A toilet leaking one gallon every

five minutes will cause the usage to jump by more than 8,500 gallons in a month (11 units of water) —and you may never hear the water running.

To check for a leak, put a little food coloring in your toilet tank. Wait ten minutes, (don't flush the toilet), the coloring begins to appear in the bowl, you have a leak. To fix the leak, try replacing the flapper gasket, adjusting or replacing the flush valve, or call a plumber.

The replaceable toilet tank parts such as flappers and washers/seals/gaskets generally will last 4-5 years on "average". If you use a chemical bowl cleaner some flappers won't even last one year.

The easiest way to determine if you have a leak is to shut off all water-using appliances, faucets and outside watering tools (do not shut off the main water line to your home), and then check to see if the flow indicator on your water meter has completely stopped moving. If you're sure no water is being used inside or outside the home, and the indicator continues to move, you've probably got a leak somewhere.

Cloudy water, also known as white water, is caused by air bubbles in the water. It is completely harmless. It usually happens when it is very cold outside because the solubility of air in water increases as water pressure increases and/or water temperature decreases. Cold water holds more air than warm water.

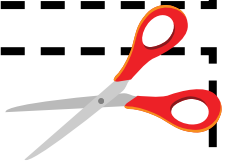

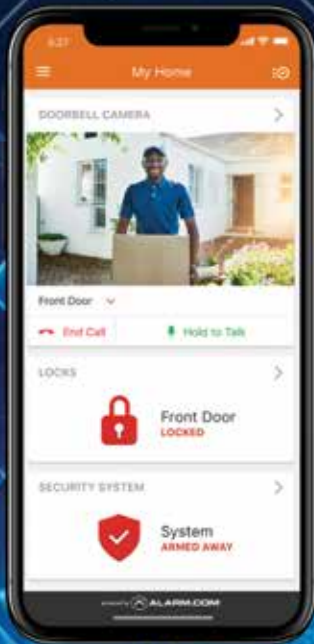

BUILDING DEPARTMENT



The purpose of Construction Codes and City Ordinances are: Intended to be adopted as a legally enforceable document that will safeguard health, safety, property, and public welfare. A code or ordinance cannot be effective without adequate provisions from its administration. Enforcement of construction and ordinance regulations are a great responsibility. No matter how detailed the code or ordinance may be, the building official must exercise judgement in determining code or ordinance compliance. The building official is responsible for assuring that the building or structure in which the citizens of the community reside are designed and constructed to be reasonably free from hazards associated with the building's or structure's use.

Selling of property in Inkster requires the owner or the seller/agent to submit an application for a Certificate of Re-Occupancy and pay \$200 for inspection. If the property is being rented you will also receive a Certification of Rental that expires after three years. If a Letter to Close is required by the seller the cost will be a \$225 deposit with \$200 being returned after the certificate is issued. This certificate does not expire as long as you own the property. If the property is sold/change of ownership the new owner must fill out a new Certificate of Re-Occupancy and pay \$200 for the inspection. We do not offer a Temporary C of O.

Rental property requires the owner to make application and pay \$185 for inspection. The Rental Certificate must be renewed every three year.

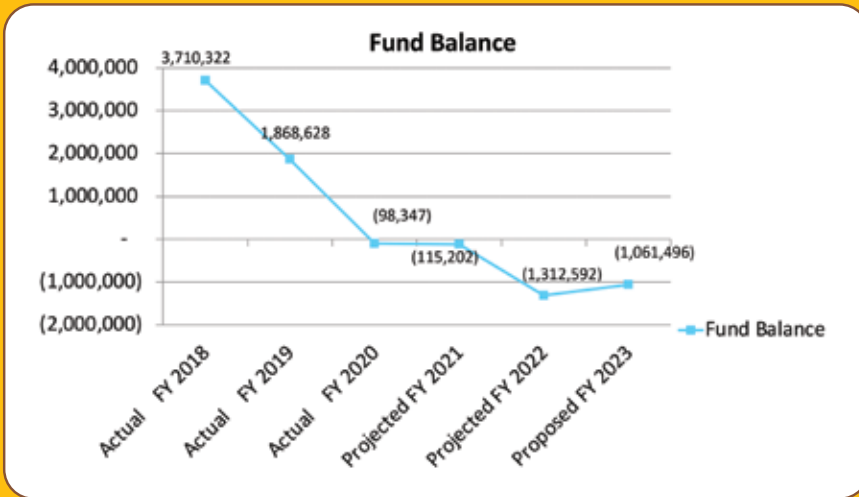

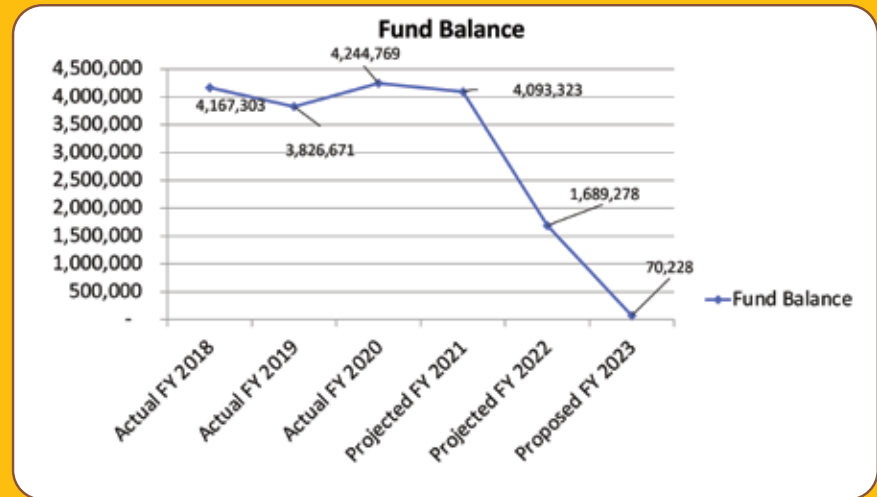

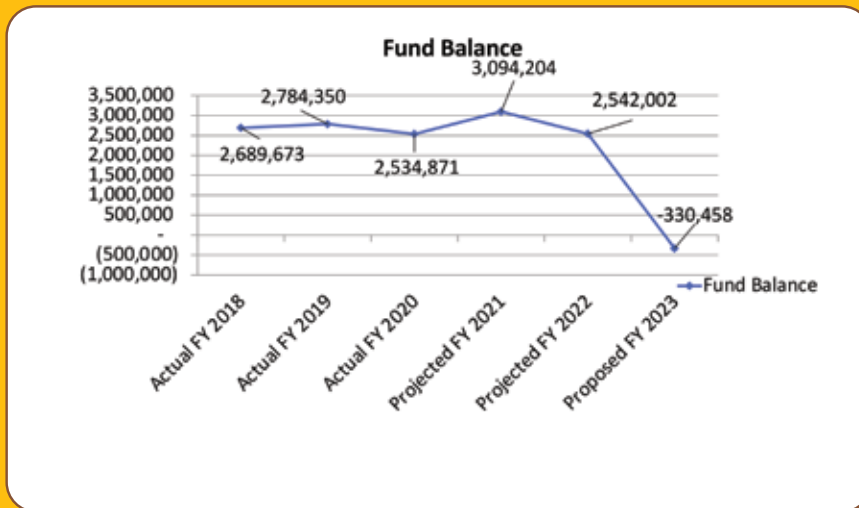
GENERAL FUND BALANCE



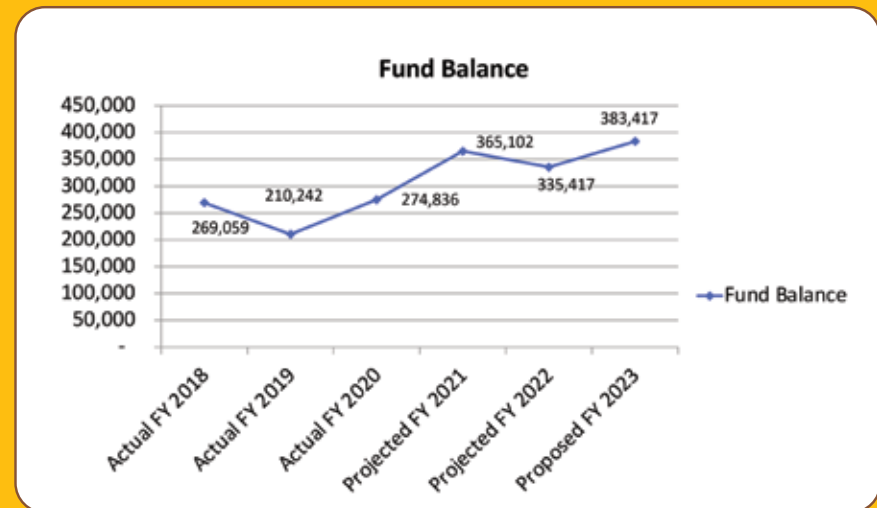
LOCAL STREET FUND BALANCE



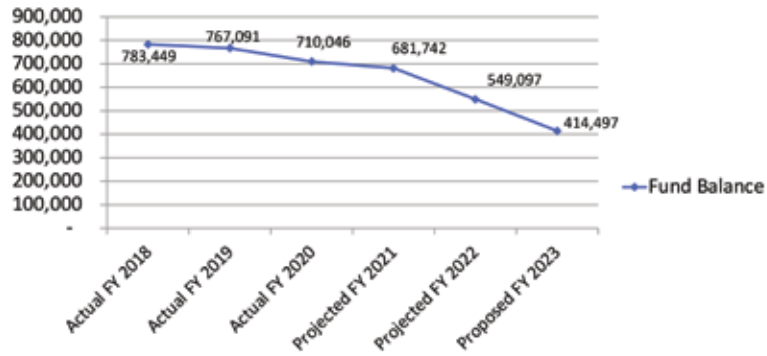
MAJOR STREET FUND BALANCE

HISTORICAL TAXABLE VALUE

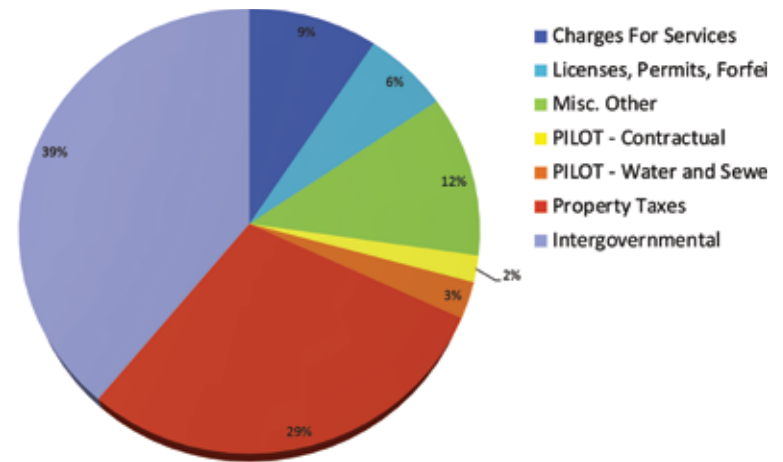

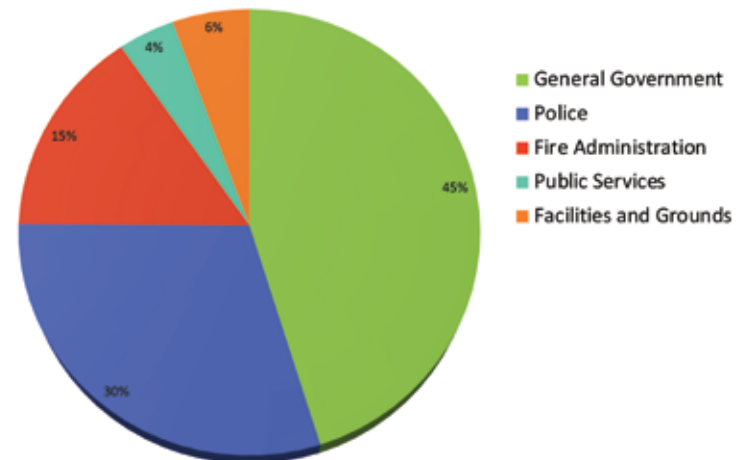

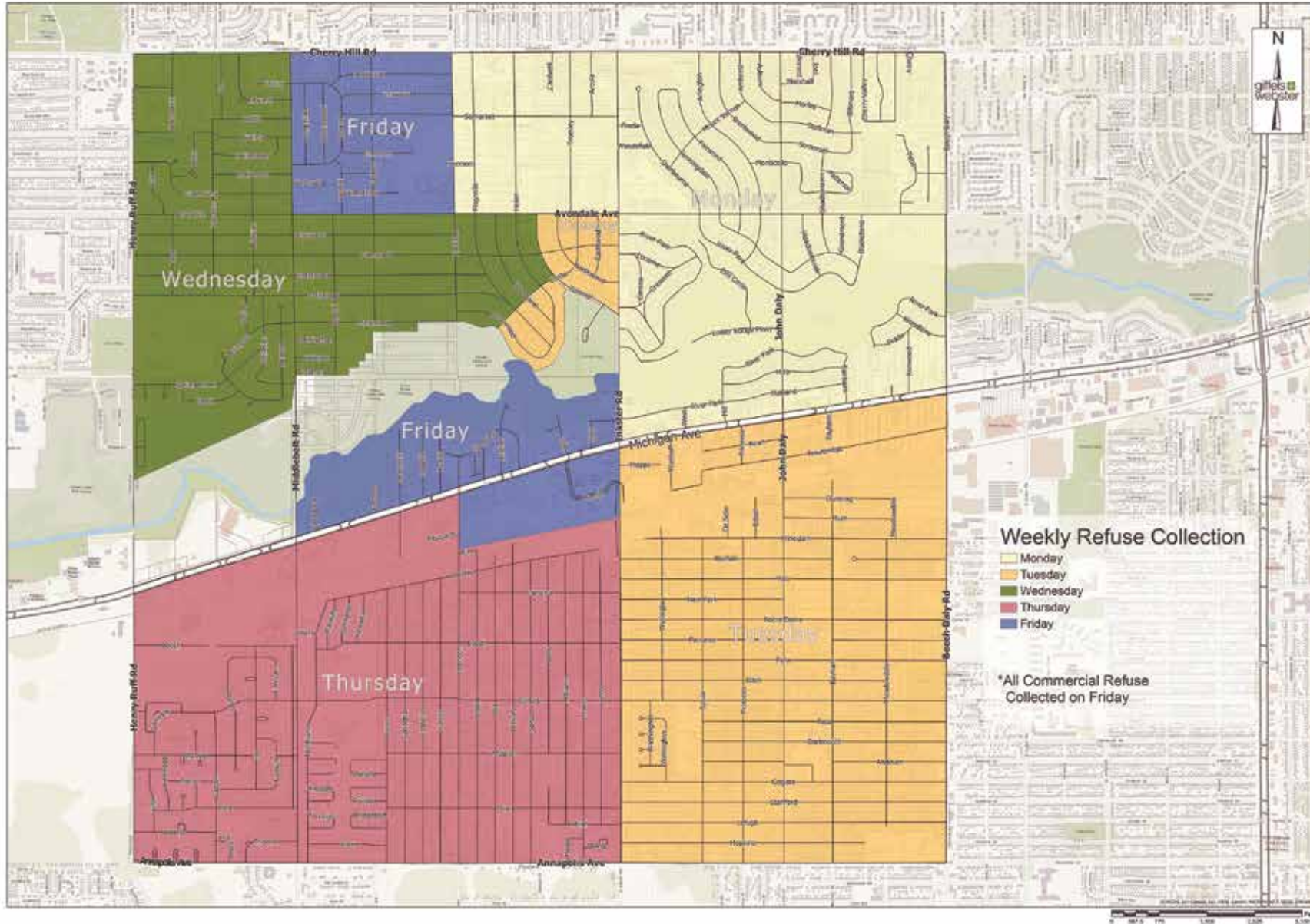

TRASH AND RECYCLE

Trash Pick-Up

During the year of 2023 trash pick-up for the City of Inkster will continue on a weekly schedule for the entire year. Your trash pick-up day (Monday through Friday) will remain the same.

Trash

Collection is delayed for certain holidays. The schedule (effective holidays) are clearly marked on the calendar.

Trash Collection

Containers should be placed at the curbside after 6pm on the day before Collection Day and should be removed from the curbside before 6pm on the Collection Day.

Proper Containers

The 95-gallon, wheeled curb cart had been provided to each household. If you have more trash than the new curb cart will hold, you will need to call for a special pick-up 48 hours in advance.

Cardboard boxes are not acceptable trash containers.

They must be broken down and thrown into the recycle container.

The Trash Contractor Does Not Pick Up:

Any EPA labeled hazardous substances, including but not limited to, gasoline, acid, inflammable or explosive materials.

Bulk Pick-Up

Heavy household items (Stoves, refrigerators, freezers, furniture) items that do not fit into the cart. You will be allowed two bulk items a week, if you have more than two items you will need to call for a dumpster. It will be picked up on your regular pick-up day. Please call (844) 464-3587 at least 48 hours ahead so that the proper moving equipment will be available. Business hours: Monday-Friday from 9:00 AM- 5:00 PM.

Brush, Wood & Carpeting

These items will be collected on your regularly scheduled collection day only if the following conditions are met (see next column)



Compost Collection - Trees, Wood, Shrubs and Brush

- Bend nails over, cut, and securely tie into bundles, not to exceed 3 inches in diameter/No longer than 4 feet/No heavier than 50 pounds. Lawn clippings, twigs, flowers and plantings are all acceptable items for compost collection. Twigs and branches shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter and 3 feet in length. Stumps, rocks, dirt, and sod are not acceptable for compost/yard waste collection. To reduce the amount of compost/yard waste GFL recommends using lawn mowers with mulching blades.

Carpet

- No longer than 4 feet/No heavier than 50 pounds/Tied and bundled
- A Resident hiring a private contractor for tree trimming/ removal must require that contractor to remove any brush, logs, or stumps.

Vacant Lots

Vacant lots are the responsibility of the owner. If vacant lots are maintained, the owner may receive a citation and the lot will be cut/cleaned at the owner's expense. Complaints should be directed to Code Enforcement at (313) 563-0835 or the Department of Public Services at (313) 563-9774.

Weekly curbside collection of yard waste begins April 5, 2023 and ends December 17, 2023.

Residents are required to separate grass clippings, leaves, weeds, and other soft yard waste from regular trash.

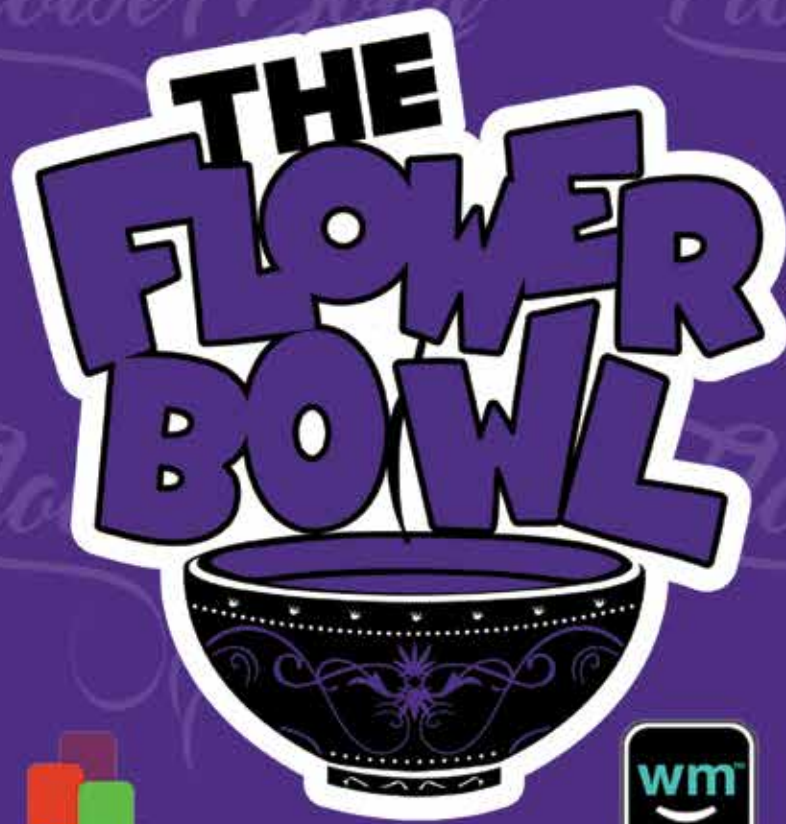

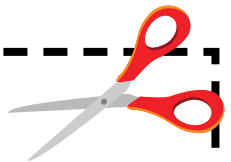

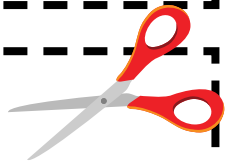
