In person registration with your local clerk with proof of residency.

NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION
Oct. 20th through 8:00 p.m. - Nov. 3rd

Some clerks will open satellite offices for voter registration. You must show proof of where you live. The documents must have your name and current address. You can show a digital copy of any document. Acceptable documents include:

Michigan driver's license or State ID card
Bank statement
Other government document

Paycheck or government check
Current utility bill

ABSENTEE BALLOT— VOTE EARLY BY MAIL

All registered voters in Michigan have the right to vote by mail. It's a safe way to vote and protect your health, and the process is secure and accurate.

Contact your city / township clerk for an absent ballot application or download one *starting on August 20th* at the Michigan Secretary of State website <https://mvlc.sos.state.mi.us/avapplication>

Submit your ballot application by email or by mail:

- Print and fill out the application, be sure to join the permanent absentee list to receive an application for future elections.
- Sign, date and take a picture of the application (or scan it). Your signature **MUST** be visible — create an email, attach the picture, send the email or mail the completed application to your local clerk.

Upon receipt of your absentee ballot:

- *Vote your ballot. **Sign the envelope and mail it to your local clerk as soon as possible.***
- If you want to deliver it in person, check your clerk's website for office hours and to confirm if there is a designated absentee ballot drop-box for your convenience.
- Utilize the MI Secretary of State website to track your voting process.



Michigan Residents Awaiting Trial, On Probation Or Parole CAN VOTE!

FACTS:

- Michigan residents confined in jail or prison who are awaiting arraignment or trial are eligible to vote.
- A person is eligible to vote the day they are released from jail or prison.
- A person that has been released is no longer "confined," even if they are on probation or parole.

LAW: A person who, in a court of this or another state or in a federal court, has been legally convicted and sentenced for a crime for which the penalty imposed is confinement in jail or prison shall not vote, offer to vote, attempt to vote, or be permitted to vote at an election while confined (see MCL 168.758b, emphasis added).

2020 GENERAL ELECTION

NOVEMBER 3, 2020

October 19th - Registration Deadline

Last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk...[or proper satellite office].

Oct. 20th through 8:00 p.m. - Nov. 3rd

In-person registration with a local clerk with proof of residency.

Oct. 30th, By 5:00 p.m.

Voters may obtain an absentee voter ballot via First Class mail.

Nov. 2nd, Up to 4:00 p.m.

Voters may obtain an absentee voter ballot in person in the clerk's office.

Nov. 3rd, Up to 8:00 p.m.

Election Day registrants may obtain and vote an absentee voter ballot in person in the clerk's office or vote in person in the proper [satellite office]...
